Rather than feeling like a number, Christiana appreciates the one-on-one time that clinic doctors and nurses take to get to know her as a person, while providing the medical treatment she needs.

Indeed we are, Ann. You are a blessing to us.





In 2019, 1,412 people received prayer, and
